Internship *Statistics*

When two equally qualified candidates are competing for a job opening, employers give the edge to the candidate who has completed an internship.

The average hourly wage for 2022-23 interns from the Ivy College of Business was \$18.41.



The retention rates for employees who served as interns are higher at the one-year and five-year marks than those who did not engage in such an experience.



According to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) the conversion rate for 2022-23 interns was **52.7%**.
